Along the way, the old cinematic veteran and the young artistic idealist enjoy an odd friendship as they chat and explore their views on the world as only they can.





As the two form a profound connection and powerful emotions come to light, Fiona's judgement is put to the test with momentous consequences as she must ultimately decide whether Adam lives or dies.


Director Dominic Savage wrote a general treatment of the general feel of the story, but without dialogue which was all improvised.

Forty-six year old Reverend Ernst Toller is the pastor at the historic First Reformed Church in upstate New York on the cusp of celebrating its 250th anniversary. Once a stop on the Underground Railroad, the church is now a tourist attraction catering to a dwindling congregation, eclipsed by its nearby parent church, Abundant Life, with its state-of-the-art facilities and 5,000-strong flock.

When a pregnant parishioner asks Reverend Toller to counsel her husband, a radical environmentalist, the clergyman finds himself plunged into his own tormented past, and equally despairing future until he embarks on a perilous self-assigned undertaking.




Chela and Chiquita are both descended from wealthy families in Asunción and have been together for over 30 years. Recently, their financial situation has worsened and they begin selling off their inherited possessions, but when their debts lead to Chiquita being imprisoned on fraud charges, Chela is forced to face a new reality. Driving for the first time in years, she begins to provide a local taxi service to a group of elderly wealthy ladies.

As Chela settles into her new life, she encounters the much younger Angy, forging a fresh and invigorating new connection. Chela finally begins to break out of her shell and engage with the world, embarking on her own personal, intimate revolution.

Both a piercing character study and a commentary on the Paraguayan class structure, an immaculate, entirely femaledriven drama that won the Silver Bear at the 2018 Berlinale.

In that difficult reassessment, Lucky must face up to what he believes in and how much it compares to his neighbours' priorities. In doing so, Lucky finds that his life has its positive side as he searches for some meaning that he can accept.

Paul, an anthropologist, is suddenly and vividly reminded of his past by a strange mix up concerning his passport at the airport when he returns to France after many years abroad in Tajikistan.

Held by security on charges of possible espionage, he recounts his story. He thinks back, feeling nostalgic, on his adolescent years. His troubled childhood, his mother's madness, the parties, the trip to the USSR where he lost his virginity, the friend who betrayed him.

Then there is the love of his life and his long-term, all consuming teenage relationship with Esther.



Cost Comparison

To help give you an idea of the subsidised cost compared to the full cost of screening a film, here is an example of cost breakdown:

Example film - Journeyman

If 30 admissions at £4.50, box office total = £135

Screen Extra cost (35%) = £47.25 inclusive of VAT and marketing described, and no additional CAE admin fee

CAE cost (for Standard member) = £96.00 (£60+VAT plus £20+VAT admin)

Distributor full cost (Filmbank) = £99.60 (plus £25 CAE admin fee if booked through CAE)

To book a film from this Screen Extra programme, log into the Screen members area, and go to 'Film Licence Requests' then 'Request Film Licence' where you will need to add details of the chosen film and complete listing information.

To book 'The Phantom of the Opera' screening and live music performance, in the first instance contact Alice with a preferred screening date. This date will be agreed with the performer before asking for a booking to be completed to confirm details.

Please note that the Creative Arts East website and Screen members area will be updated in the autumn and the new booking procedure will then be advised.

Please book as soon as possible, and in order to help us with booking with distributors, would ask you to book winter screenings by Wednesday 31st October if at all possible.

We will still be accepting bookings after this date, but they must be least 4 weeks before the screening date, and screenings must take place before 31st March 2019.

Additional Information

If any group would like to view a film ahead of booking, then this can be arranged through arranging/reimbursing cinema admission or providing DVD/Blu-ray as required.

Trailers of all films are included in a DVD that has been posted out along with a printed copy of the programme.
