With Easter fast approaching and the school holidays already in full swing, we are being kept very busy across the Attleborough area. Speeding and Anti-Social Behaviour caused by Vehicles in the Town Centre and surrounding villages remains a priority for our Safer Neighbourhood team. In terms of crime, we have seen a slight increase in Burglaries of sheds, garages and outbuildings in the rural community. A large number of these crimes are committed by opportunists who target insecure vehicles and buildings or specifically target valuable items that are left on display. This includes garden tools such as lawn mowers, chain saws, strimmers and leaf blowers but also includes trailers, quad bikes and even larger farm yard plant and equipment. I appreciate that everyone leads very busy lives but we need to get into the habit of securing our possessions, making sure that they are property marked and reporting any suspicious or out of the ordinary activity. Our next SNAP meeting will be held on 25th June 2019 at 11.00 in Attleborough Town Hall where you are invited to attend to raise any local concerns and participate in voting in our next priorities. In the meantime your Beat Managers will be attending various engagement events around the area, including coffee mornings and school visits. Do say hello if you see them about! Finally, I would like to extend my sincere thanks to Mayor, Vera Dale's invitation to attend her Civic Reception, which our Beat Managers and the Engagement Officer were privileged to attend.

Crime Update (March 2019)

Crime Statistics are provided for the preceding month. The data relates to the cluster of Parishes as detailed overleaf. Further statistical data (including offences & location detail) can be obtained from www.police.co.uk

Offence	Numbers	What This Could Entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	2	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary Residential	1	Residential Burglary will encompass entry to any building within the curtilage/ boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Burglary Business and Community	4	Business and community Burglaries will include shops, businesses and other property. In general, the purpose for which a building is designed will determine whether it should be classified as 'Residential' or 'Business and Community'.
Criminal Damage	4	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	4	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	1	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	1	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	3	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	1	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
