We are already in June and fast approaching the school summer holidays. Local Beat Managers, PC Wicks and PC London are proactively policing the Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel (SNAP) priorities of Speeding across the Attleborough area, carrying out enforcement patrols of the local speed limits. We are very fortunate to have several very proactive Community Speedwatch teams whose volunteer work in helping to keep our roads safe complements formal enforcement by Police. Officers from the Safer Neighbourhood Team, Response and our Neighbourhood Policing Team have been carrying out priority patrols in the area and I am pleased to be able to report that a male has been arrested in connection with these offences. However, I would urge residents not to become complacent and to protect against such offences by removing valuables from vehicles and always lock and secure your vehicle when it is not in use.

## What is Happening In Your Area

Your local officers covering the Attleborough and surrounding parishes have been kept very busy this month. Beat Managers PC Wicks and PC London have continued to proactively police the local Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel (SNAP) Priorities carrying out enforcement of our local speed limits across the area including Stow Bedon and Rocklands. While our Response Officers acted swiftly on information provided by a member of the public about a vehicle being used without MOT. Further enquiries showed this vehicle not to have insurance and was seized. The Beat Managers have also been carrying out School Engagements, visiting Hall Farm Nursery School and providing the children with an opportunity to look around our police vehicles. They also acted on concerns raised over road safety in Great Ellingham supporting the road crossing patrol while our Neighbourhood Policing Team carried out some plain clothes patrols and dealt with a male for possession of cannabis in Attleborough. Finally, don't forget to attend the next SNAP meeting at Attleborough Town Hall on Tuesday 25th June at 11am.

Offence	Numbers	What This Could Entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary Residential	4	Residential Burglary will encompass entry to any building within the curtilage/ boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Burglary Business and Community	2	Business and community Burglaries will include shops, businesses and other property. In general, the purpose for which a building is designed will determine whether it should be classified as 'Residential' or 'Business and Community'.
Criminal Damage	7	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	10	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	3	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	1	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	1	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	2	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
