031.19) Attleborough Academy Norfolk - Appointment to Committee Proposal

SLCC Advice Note AD98 – Committees: Appointment of Committees, Sub-Committees and Joint Committees was circulated. The CEO referenced both AD98 and the ANP Terms of Reference and advised whilst she fully supported youth inclusion any changes to membership or Terms of Reference would have to need to go before a Full Council. It seemed non-Councillor members would not have voting rights on the committee and it was unclear whether or not they should be 18 years or over and the CEO was seeking further advice on this matter. Cllr Tyrer believed this information to be incorrect as confirmed he had considered the Localism Act and believed a pupil could be a member and have voting rights in line with guidance to NP Steering Groups. There was long discussion and whilst all members fully supported the inclusion of young people it was unclear if the committee was the appropriate forum for such interaction. Many members suggested a working group would be more appropriate for the young people and this could be more informal with a better atmosphere. Cllr Redmond wished to approach the young people directly via the Schools and to ensure inclusion of all age groups not just Academy students.

On a motion from Cllr Loades, seconded by Cllr Bulmer, it was

## 035.19 S106 and Linear Park

# a) Update from Simon Wood, Director of Planning and Building Control, Breckland District Council

Simon Wood introduced himself and explained he was invited to give an update as to the progress made in terms of the application itself and of the Section 106 agreement that is currently being negotiated and agreed with the applicant. Until that S106 agreement which seeks to establish planning obligations in relation to the provision of affordable housing, the delivery of elements such as the Linear Park, the Community Centre, Schools primary and secondary contributions and the local neighbourhood centre, Highways infrastructure, health, drainage etc. until that is concluded agreed and signed then decision notices not issued and the decision hasn't formally been made so in terms of negotiations in respect of the legal agreement we have regular meetings with the applicant and their legal advisors, County Council and their legal advisors and we have come and had meetings on several occasions with representatives from the Town Council. The obligations to deliver many benefits and infrastructures requirements in terms of affordable housing there will be approx. 10-13% and uplift agreed. In terms of schools the contribution levels have been agreed, we have agreed the trigger points for those contributions and how schools are to be delivered. Also agreed to provide indoor sports provision which is likely to be provided as part of the Academy Masterplan but timings are still in discussion. The Community Centre forms part of that and we agreed in principal where it is to be located, some discussion to size but that is now being agreed in line with wishes of the Town Council. There is a contribution towards that being constructed as well there is the option for the Town Council to deliver it itself or get a building built for that sum and deliver for occupation and future management. The delivery of The Linear Park will be phased but we are looking for the Linear Park to be agreed as a scheme as a single reserve matters application, it will be a formal planning application and prior to any development commencing they will need to agree with us and other interested parties and there is a strategy around the delivery of the Linear Park. Its' objectives, its' means and the fact that within the Neighbourhood Plan a significant factor there in terms of forming the provision and the objective but going forward still in discussions about how to manage and maintain it and there will be future meetings with the Town Council to establish exactly what that format will be. Also one of the issues were the level crossings and the provision of a footbridge which has to be

provided and the Link Road have to be delivered before 1,200 houses are occupied. Dates for the next meeting to be held with ATC are being arranged at the moment.

Cllr Tyrer confirmed he had met with Robert Campbell (Breckland Council) in Cambridge on employment and felt it would be good to meet with him and Mr Wood quarterly. **b) Meeting notes of informal SUE/S106 Meeting** – Noted for information and the CEO confirmed an email response had been sent to Mr Wood, Breckland, and a further meeting will be held to tweak the last few issues within the S106 document.

#### 036.19) Attleborough Academy Norfolk - Appointment to Committee Proposal

The Chairman revisited the appointment of an Academy student to the committee and the membership of the Committee was further discussed. The CEO confirmed a previous resolution existed where members of the Community were resolved as leads on the different themes within the ANP and she agreed to locate for consideration at the next meeting. Several members could not see any merit in adding to the membership and felt a smaller group was beneficial to make decisions and make progress. Many suggested working groups were the appropriate way to engage with the public and include the youth. The Chairman stated the views of the Council were not respected by the community and the ANP is community led not Council led. There was a very lengthy discussion with much difference of opinion.

On the motion of Cllr Tyrer, seconded by Cllr Taylor it was

**RESOLVED** by use of the Chairman's casting vote to recommend to Full Council the appointment to the ANP Committee of a member who will be an Academy student.
