ATC provided initial funding for the creation and operation of ATTCARE [Attleborough Health, Care & Wellbeing Trust] in July 2017 of £5,000.

We have operated as frugally as possible, with considerable direct work undertaken by the trustees, and kept expenditure low even with the appropriate charity status compliance and insurance cover.

The total expenditure from July 2017 until 30th September 2020 was £2,900. We would now wish to secure our operating cost for the next period to 30th September 2023 as well as using some funds to ensure the current Research Project programme can be delivered.

Our request for operating support would be £2,500 to 31st March 2023.

In addition; we would ask the Town Council to consider "Match Funding" the grant received from Norfolk Community Foundation of £5,000 towards the commissioning of the comprehensive research project to provide a robust framework for the sustainable Health and Care needs of the expanded town until 2035.

The Detailed research will be in two linked sections to collect data and apply the information to the projected demographics and needs of the greater Attleborough area. The work will be undertaken by University of East Anglia [UEA] Medical Economics team.

The outcome and data within such research will be freely available to the Neighbourhood plan group and will help to guide Local Economy, Education, Sports, Wellbeing and Design Quality themes as well as Health and Social care.

The project will cost £27,600 [being £23,000 plus VAT] and we have secured £16,500 from other grant funds [Attleborough Town Charities and Geoffrey Watling Trust] which, together with £1,500 from our own current funds, provides £18,000 towards the total.

As mentioned to the Council and to ANP group in the past, this project will need to be appropriate, robust and sustainable which we believe the specialist medical economics research team within University of East Anglia can provide.

1 Accounting Policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant notes to these accounts. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 and Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and Charities Act 2011.

Attleborough Health, Care and Well-being Trust constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

The accounts present a true and fair view and no changes have been made to the accounting policies adopted in note 1.1.

No changes to accounting estimates have occurred in the reporting period.

No material prior year errors have been identified in the reporting period.

In preparing the accounts, the trustees have considered whether in applying the accounting policies required by FRS 102 SORP a restatement of comparative items was needed. No restatements were required.

1.2 Income

Recognition of income

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when:

- · the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
- · it is more likely than not that the trustees will receive the resources;
- the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Offsetting

There has been no offsetting of assets and liabilities, or income and expenses, unless required or permitted by the FRS 102 SORP.

1.3 Grants and donations

Grants and donations are only included in the SoFA when the general income recognition criteria are met.

1.4 Legacies

Legacies are included in the SOFA when receipt is probable, that is, when there has been grant of probate, the executors have established that there are sufficient assets in the estate and any conditions attached to the legacy are either within the control of the charity or have been met.

1.5 Fund Accounting

Restricted funds are to be used for the specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund.

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources received or generated for the charitable purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by trustees for particular purposes.
