Norfolk Police have a new initiative which we are calling #ParkWalkTalk which will see our officers driving out to the parishes and towns, parking up and walking around the local community, taking advantage to stop and chat with local residents and business owners. If you see our officers out on foot beat, do give them a wave, or even better, walk with them and have a chat!

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

Your Local Policing Team Beat Managers have been busy this month focusing on their Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel (SNAP) Priorities. The Beat Managers have carried out speed checks across the policing area along with our volunteer Community Speedwatch Teams who have supported the Global Road Safety week by monitoring vehicles speeds in our villages. The team have also carried out a section 23 Misuse of Drugs Act warrant in Besthorpe which resulted in a large cannabis grow being discovered and the suspect being interviewed and reported for the offence. The Beat Managers have conducted joint visits with our partners in Housing to address ASB in areas of Attleborough and conducted foot patrols of hot spots within the town. Attleborough Beat Managers have also carried out joint patrols with Breckland Council COVID marshals and finally officers from both towns have conducted both uniform and plain clothed patrols to tackle drug use and supply within Thetford and Attleborough.

CRIME UPDATES (May 2021)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	1	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	1	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	1	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	3	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	5	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	11	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
