### **CRIME UPDATES (December 2021)**

0 0	Damage caused as a result of fire.  Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.  A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
0

2	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
4	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
11	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
1	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
3	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
0	From a public place, if stolen form a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
