### A11 Spooner Row to Tuttle Interchange reconstruction scheme

I'm writing to provide you with an update regarding the upcoming reconstruction of the road surface on this stretch of the A11.

As I'm sure you're aware, we've been very busy with the reconstruction of the A11, replacing the old concrete road with a new modern road that will be less noisy and better to drive on. Having a contraflow traffic management system in place allows us to undertake a lot of our work during the day, rather than at night. This means that local residents will on occasion hear various construction activities during the day, and on some weekends.

We'd like to apologise in advance for any disturbance caused by our activity. Rest assured, we'll do our best to keep any disruption down to a minimum. We hope you agree that completing such activities during the day is much better than doing them during the night.

We will continue to plan to undertake the vast majority of noisy activities during daytime hours. But, there might be a requirement for us to undertake some nighttime activities, and we will of course let you know when they are planned to take place.

### Keeping the community updated

We've sent a letter discussing the above to every home within a 500m of the scheme, so we can ensure that the local communities who will be impacted by our activity have been informed. We've also provided them with a 24/7 telephone number and email address for the project, so they can get in contact if required.
