# A11 Spooner Row to Tuttles Interchange reconstruction scheme – B1135 closure

I'm writing to provide you with an update regarding the upcoming reconstruction of the road on this stretch of the A11.

### **Vegetation clearance**

This activity will take place each evening between the hours of 8pm to 6am in the morning, starting on the 1 August 2022 and continuing until 4 August 2022.

This activity will be completed at night so we can make the most efficient use of our time and also so we can complete the louder construction activities during the day.

We'll start the vegetation clearance along the B1135 near the Tuttles Interchange on 1 August 2022. We'll need to close the B1135 so we can complete the work in the safest way possible, while also allowing us to keep the B1135 open during the day.

The vegetation clearance will then move to the Spooner Row section of the scheme on 2 and 3 August, before then reaching the A11 near to Sparrow Avenue on 4 August.

We only expect to be in each location for one or two nights before then moving on to the next one, and we'd like to apologise in advance for any disturbance caused.

### Resurfacing

We've made good progress with the scheme and can now start resurfacing the northbound carriageway. This activity will take place each evening between the hours of 8pm to 6am in the morning, starting on the 8 August 2022 and continuing until Autumn 2022.

Although resurfacing is not considered to be an activity that causes a noise disturbance, we're aware that since we're now in summer, windows might be open at night, while still evenings can also help to carry the sound of our activity further. We'll instruct our teams to do their best to keep any disruption down to a minimum and apologise in advance for any disturbance that might be caused.

All dates are subject to change due to operational requirements.

### Keeping the community updated

We've sent a letter discussing the above to every home within a 500m of the scheme, so we can ensure that the local communities who will be impacted by our activity have been informed. We've also provided them with a 24/7 telephone number and email address for the project, so they can get in contact if required.
