Dear Ladies & Gentlemen,

Last Friday 17th June my mother, [REDACTED] went to the church hall for her lunch club which she does every fortnight. I dropped her off on my way home to South Yorkshire. She planned to catch the bus home as usual. On this occasion the bus didn't arrive. It was very hot & there is no shelter at the seat at the top of Hargham Road, natural or otherwise. She & her friend who had also been to the lunch are both over 90 years old. They had to wait for about an hour in temperature of 30C + & were both feeling unwell by the time the bus arrived. Neither of them had any means to call for assistance.

I would like you to consider putting a shelter at the seat there. It is a seat that is frequently used when people are waiting for the bus to go down Hargham Road. It would also give some protection when it rains.

By the sounds of their symptoms it is lucky that there wasn't a medical emergency as both ladies went straight to their beds when they got to their homes with water & tea as they felt so ill.

Just for your information, I will be contacting the bus service too because two buses arrived at the same time. I'm aware that there are roadworks on the A11 but as the bus goes along the old A11 it shouldn't make any difference.

Dear Mr Leslie

Large Vehicles Travelling Along Church Street, Attleborough and Associated Road Safety

I am writing as I feel that I must bring this to your attention. Last Friday I had just left St Mary's church gate onto Church Street and I was walking towards the pedestrian crossing when an enormous articulated lorry drove past, albeit at a reasonable speed. As the vehicle approached me, I could see that the walls of the tyres were rubbing along the edge of the kerb which was extremely concerning as I felt that I could easily have been drawn into its path. But the worst was yet to come. As the vehicle passed me the cooling system behind the lorry's cab was blowing out hot air through its grilles along with dust and grit which blasted my face and eyes with very hot air, on what was the hottest day of the year.

This whole experience was most disconcerting and frightening as I could not step back any further on the narrow pathway where the church wall is to avoid feeling trapped.

No doubt the lorry driver had no option but to drive so close to the path due to the cars which were parked in the area outside the shops opposite. To me the whole experience shows that it is unsafe to continue having heavy vehicles passing parked cars where there is insufficient space to allow them to use the full width of the road and therefore parking should be prohibited from outside these shops when there is a free car park so close by.

In addition, the last time I was at the junction of the High Street, Exchange Street and Connaught Road, the barriers that were erected to protect pedestrians had no doubt been hit by large vehicles negotiating the bend and were partially mangled.

I moved from London to Attleborough, where I do like living, but my feeling is that this is an unacceptable and highly dangerous situation for pedestrians to feel safe on the town's roads. To conclude, I ask you to consider stopping all parking outside the shops which would allow heavier vehicles to keep clear of pathways on both sides of the road. I look forward to hearing your response.
