

A11 Tuttles Interchange to Thickthorn roundabout (Hethersett Bypass) concrete repairs

Advanced notification of closure of northbound carriageway on A11 Tuttles Interchange to Thickthorn roundabout (Hethersett Bypass)

I'm writing to let you know that we will be completing nightworks on the A11 Hethersett Bypass northbound carriageway on Monday 27 February 2023 to Friday 17 March from 8pm until 6am.

This is so we can undertake urgent carriageway repairs.

To ensure the safety of our workers and help keep disruption to a minimum, we'll be doing this work overnight when there is typically less traffic on the road. We're sorry for any disturbance caused by our activity and for any delays encountered as a result of this work.

Northbound - During this time, traffic wishing to travel northbound on the A11 will be diverted along the A1066 at Thetford, before travelling eastbound on the A140, and then northbound towards the A47. At the A47 junction join the A47 westbound to Thickthorn interchange.

A fully signed diversion route will be in place, and we've included a copy of the route map at the end of this letter. You can also visit our website to view an interactive version of the map: www.nationalhighways.co.uk/A11concrete.

Please note that the date and times of this work may be subject to change due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances. Where possible, we'll keep you updated of significant changes on our website. Please check our project webpage for the latest information before you travel.
