## Advanced notification of overnight resurfacing

I'm writing to provide you with an update on the reconstruction of the A11 carriageway between Spooner Row and the Tuttles Interchange at Wymondham.

We've made good progress with our work and have finished rebuilding the foundations of the first section of the southbound carriageway, which means we're ready to begin laying the new asphalt road surface.

Once complete, this will improve safety and provide a smoother, quieter journey. It'll also provide a new modern road with a 40 to 50-year lifespan that'll be easier and quicker for us to repair in future.

This work will start on Tuesday 14 March and is expected to be finished by the end of June 2023. It will be carried out between 8pm and 6am each night, and no changes will be made to the current layout of the road. Road users will be able to continue using the contraflow that's already in place while we carry out this work.

## How will this work affect the local community?

Resurfacing is not typically considered to be a noisy activity; however, we will need to use a 'percussive roller', which uses vibrations to compact the new road. There is a chance that some residents may notice minor vibrations as a result of this work and we're sorry for the inconvenience this may cause.

We'd like to assure you that we'll only be using the percussive roller for one or two nights in each location, and we work within specific limits when it comes to noise and vibration. We'll aim to keep disruption to a minimum and our team will use specialist equipment to measure vibrations to ensure we're working within our limits.
